⁴ Councilman Lee received \$2,500 on 3/13/2019, \$2,500 on 10/21/2019, and \$1,000 on 12/17/2019. These donations were all in different election cycles and therefore do not exceed the donation limits.

⁵ Councilman Templet received \$1,000 of this total amount in 2018, before he announced his candidacy for the At-Large seat. An additional \$500 of this amount was donated after Councilman Templet had already won his election for the At-Large seat. Therefore, these donations do not exceed the \$5,000 per election cycle limit for At-Large Councilmembers.

⁶ This amount is comprised of donations from Pivotal Engineering and its two co-owners. Although Parish rules require Pivotal to disclose any donations made by its co-owners because they own more than 25% of Pivotal, each of their donations are within the per-person limit. *See* Ethics Board Opinions 2014-097 (individual could make maximum donations in both his personal capacity and in his capacity as majority owner of an LLC) and 2006-476 (where individual owned 50% of an LLC, he could make donations in both his personal capacity and in the LLC's capacity without those donations being aggregated). Councilwoman Van Vrancken received \$900 from Pivotal Engineering and \$2,250 total from Pivotal's principals, each of which are within the donation limit \$2,500 per donor per election cycle for district-level Councilmembers.

⁷ Councilman Bonano received \$2,000 of this total amount during the election cycle leading up to the primary on 10/12/2019; he received the remaining \$2,500 during the election cycle leading up to the runoff on 11/16/2019. Primaries and runoffs are considered separate election cycles. *See* La. R.S. 18:1505.2(H)(3)(a).

⁸ According to filings with the Louisiana Board of Ethics, Councilman Impastato received \$2,500 of this total amount from Meyer Engineers. The remaining \$500 was donated by RM Investments, a related company.

⁹ Councilman Lee received \$2,500 of this amount from R.M. Development Corporation, a related company. Of the \$7,500 that was donated by Meyer Engineers, \$2,500 was donated during the election cycle leading up to the primary on 10/12/2019. An additional \$2,500 was donated during the election cycle leading up to the 11/16/2019 runoff. Finally, the last \$2,500 was donated in December 2019 and counts toward the current election cycle. Because primaries and runoffs are considered separate election cycles, none of these donations exceeds the \$2,500 donation limit per election cycle. *See* La. R.S. 18:1505.2(H)(3)(a).

¹⁰ Councilman Bonano received \$1,000 of this total amount during the election cycle leading up to the primary on 10/12/2019. He received \$1,500 during the election cycle leading up to the runoff on 11/16/2019. The remaining \$500 was donated on 3/4/2020 and counts toward the current election cycle. Because primaries and runoffs are considered separate election cycles, these donations do not exceed the donation limit per election cycle.

¹¹ Councilman Lee received \$2,500 of this total amount during the election cycle leading up to the primary on 10/12/2019. He received the remaining \$2,500 on 12/17/2019, which counts toward the current election cycle.

Councilman Lee then received \$1,000 during the election cycle leading up to the 11/16.2019 runoff election. Lastly, he received \$1,000 on 12/17/2019, which counts toward the current election cycle. Because primaries and runoffs are considered separation election cycles, these contributions do not exceed the \$2,500 donation limit per election cycle.
